Howard University College of Pharmacy, Department of Clinical & Administrative Pharmacy Sciences (CAPS) invites applicants for a non-tenure track 12-month appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor. Candidates must possess a terminal doctoral degree and have teaching and research interests that are consistent with the College's mission to provide pharmaceutical education of excellent quality to students of high academic, scholarship and leadership potential. A focus of the clinical and services endeavors of the College is to engage in clinical practice, and provide service to the community, particularly impacting minority populations. Postgraduate training is a requirement of this position. Clinical experience in ambulatory care, community, or hospital setting, and some experience with didactic and experiential teaching is preferred. Candidates must be licensed or eligible for licensure in Washington, DC and demonstrate excellent written and oral communication skills, clinical skills and teaching skills. Preference will be given to candidates with strong cognitive skills, a record of peer-reviewed publications, relevant teaching experience and scholarship activity, commensurate with the position rank of Assistant Professor.

The duties and responsibilities for this position include, but are not limited to: a) mentoring and teaching within the College's Doctor of Pharmacy program; b) establishment of a practice site; c) developing interdisciplinary collaborations (practice and research) with colleagues within the College of Pharmacy as well as with colleagues in the other schools and colleges across campus; and c) contributing to the growth and expansion of the CAPS Department, and the College of Pharmacy.

Founded in 1867, Howard University, located in Washington D.C., is a private co-educational institution of higher learning. The university has over 10,500 students enrolled in 13 schools and colleges. This includes a full academic health center with Colleges of Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing and Allied Health Sciences as well as Howard University Hospital and the Louis Stokes Health Sciences Library. The College of Pharmacy at Howard University has been a place of great educational opportunity for students of all ethnicities and backgrounds. CAPS currently has 20 full-time faculty members. In conjunction with the Department of Clinical and Administrative Pharmacy Sciences, the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences is responsible for the education and training of 300 Pharm. D. and 20 Ph.D. students annually. The department also has active externally funded research programs and excellent opportunities for collaborative research.

Salary is competitive and commensurate with education and experience, with excellent fringe benefits. Review of applications will begin immediately, and continue until the position is filled.
