Equitable Community Access to Pharmacist Services Act (ECAPS) H.R. 1770/S. 2477 and Provider Status Recognition

Last month on February 29, 2024, over 140 groups, including WMSHP as an affiliate of ASHP, urged Congress to enact the Equitable Community Access to Pharmacist Services Act (ECAPS) (H.R. 1770/S. 2477) bipartisan legislation to ensure senior access to essential pharmacist services such as tests (COVID-19, flu, RSV, and strep throat), vaccines (COVID-19, flu, pneumococcal, and Hepatitis B), and treatments (COVID-19, flu, RSV, and strep throat) by creating Medicare Part B direct reimbursement mechanisms. These diversely representative groups united to advocate for equitable access to community pharmacy services on behalf of Medicare beneficiaries, rural communities, patients living with chronic and complex conditions, caregivers, and others with limited access to health care via passage and enactment of ECAPS, which was first introduced in the U.S House of Representatives on March 23, 2023 and in the U.S. Senate on July 25, 2023.

A day later, effective March 1, 2024, similar collaborative efforts by various pharmacy organizations, including Pennsylvania Pharmacists Association, succeeded in granting pharmacists provider status and allowing them to bill Pennsylvania Medicaid for rendered services in alignment with Pharmacy Practice Act and amendments per Act 80 of 2020 and State Board of Pharmacy regulations as reported by the National Alliance of State Pharmacy Associations (NASPA). This was also made possible by the acknowledgment by PA Medical Assistance of pharmacists' scope of practice and impact on patient outcomes by seeking a state plan amendment from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to add licensed pharmacist services to Other Licensed Practitioner (OLP) benefit. Now pharmacists licensed in PA who are enrolled with PA Medicaid and individual Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) can provide services in all outpatient settings where they have the ability to bill medial claims (i.e., community pharmacies, ambulatory clinics, medical offices, etc.). The Provider Enrollment application and a recording of the training from 2/15/2024 is available on the PA Department of Human Services (DHS) website under 10-Midlevel Practitioner. This recognition underscores the crucial role pharmacists play in healthcare delivery, particularly in underserved communities.




Secretary Tiffany Tseng

Maryland License Renewal

For those that need to renew their Maryland Pharmacist License before it expires April 30, 2024, this is a reminder that effective as of 04/01/2022, law was passed to require a one-time continuing education credit in Implicit Bias. Pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 1-225, all health practitioners must attest to completing an implicit bias training program approved by the Cultural and Linguistic Health Care Professional Competency Program on their first license renewal after April 1, 2022.
